## 2011 Millcreek Giant Round Robin Erie PA April 16-17, 2011 by Sam Steiner

This year we were able to expand this popular event to two days, with Saturday being the singles giant round robin as in past years, and Sunday a 2-Person Team giant round robin. About 75% of the players competed both days giving them a grueling NA Teams-style schedule with as many as 15 matches over the weekend similar against playing levels.

In division 1, basically an



Open event, a cherry-picking Samson Dubina captured first place without much challenge, losing only one game to Toronto's Colin Greenidge. Chip Coulter took 2<sup>nd</sup> with a win over practice partner Randy Seemiller who settled for 3<sup>rd</sup>. Notable was strong play by 12-year-old Filip Ilijevski of Toronto in his first visit to Erie, with a 3-2 win over a sluggish A.J. Carney.

Division 2 saw Pittsburgh lefty Ken Roskos return to past form defeating all 8 opponents to take first. A strong-looking Will Humber of State College came out on top of a 3-way tie for 2<sup>nd</sup> with Richard Chan of Pittsburgh and Marc Maronian of Rochester.

In division 3 Sam Russel made the trek from Lancaster PA to capture 1<sup>st</sup> place over Alex Bateman and Francis Wong in spite of a loss to a non-tieing player.


